

# How to Share Housing with Others Until You're Up to Date with Your COVID Vaccines



## Hygiene and Precaution

When coming back from the fields, wear a mask, wash your hands, use hand sanitizer, and wash worker's clothes separately.



## Clean and Safe Household

In shared areas, stay at least 6 feet apart from people who may not be vaccinated. Don't share your tools and utensils. Keep all frequently touched surfaces clean.



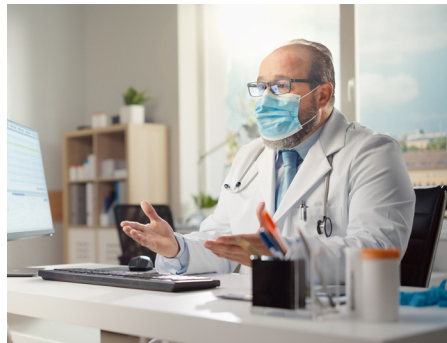
## People at High Risk

If you or anyone else in your household is at high risk (older adults and people with illnesses) and is unvaccinated, you should take [additional physical distancing and hygiene precautions](#).



## If Anyone Is Sick

If you or anyone else in your household has symptoms of COVID-19, you should isolate and not use shared areas. Everyone in the household should wear masks.
